PhD Scholarships to investigate issues associated with emergency/disaster situations and young children at Macquarie University, Sydney Australia www.mq.edu.au

Closing date: Macquarie University accepts PhD students at all times of the year. There is no closing date for applications.

Ph.D. scholarships are available in the Macquarie University *Centre for Children and Families Research Centre (Institute of Early Childhood Education) and/or the Research Centre on Social Inclusion (CRSI)*.

The scholarships have been developed to enable new research to be directed toward this critical issue – and can include a wide variety of topics which focus on programming and/or policy within specific regions or from an international perspective. A field work component will be included.

The applicants should have experience in empirical (quantitative and/or qualitative) research methods and principles, good (English) writing skills, and a background in emergency/disaster programs or related experience*.

Scholarships are available to domestic or international students. The scholarship covers tuition fees and pays a tax exempt living allowance (about \$20,000 per annum). Other funding for costs associated with the research project are negotiable. The tenure is for a maximum 3.5 years full time, subject to satisfactory progress. The student is expected to be resident in Australia for a significant portion of that time. Joint enrolment with selected international partner universities is also possible.
